

Report to the Public Health Partnership Board 26 June 2006

Big lottery Health and Well-being Fund

Background

The Big Lottery is currently looking for **national** and **regional** portfolio bids to its Health and Well-being Fund aimed at achieving three outcomes:-

- **Increasing Physical Activity** - focusing on: the most sedentary, integrating activity into daily life and supporting communities
- **Improving Mental Well-being** - focusing on: user involvement, preventative approaches and tackling stigma
- **People Eating More Healthy** - focusing on: promoting healthy eating, access to healthy foods, children's knowledge

A Yorkshire and the Humber portfolio bid is being coordinated by a regional steering group made up of:-

- DH Regional Public Health Group
- Yorkshire and Humber Health Authority
- Care Services Improvement Partnership
- Sport England
- Yorkshire Forward
- Government Office
- Regional Forum
- Yorkshire Culture
- Yorkshire and Humber Assembly
- Local Government Yorkshire and Humber
- Regional Forum on Ageing
- Public Health Observatory

Nationally the total sum available is £165 million over five years. The Yorkshire and Humber bid is likely to be of the order of £10-15 million. For Sheffield this is likely to equate to **up to £1 million over the five years** plus the benefit of any region wide activity. The bid will be focused on supporting the delivery of Community Strategies and Local Area Agreements, ensuring maximum delivery within communities.

LSP's across the region have been invited to develop mini portfolio's to sit within the regional bid through their health partnerships (with their LSP health lead coordinating input). It has been suggested that these could be 1-10 projects focusing on one, two or all three of the headline outcomes. In addition to this the bid is likely to include some regional activity such as training, capacity building or social marketing. LSPs have been asked to identify any opportunities for effective regional activity or projects that could be developed across a number of areas.

Timescales

Submission of the regional bid will be in two stages:

- **Stage1:** Overarching outline bid by **28 July**
- **Stage2:** If successful, detailed bid including worked up local projects by 1 March 2007

Requirements at stage 1

At stage 1 we will be asked to provide:-

- A description of need against the outcomes we are focusing on

- A description of our target population
- The key outcomes we will achieve locally
- A short description of the activities to be delivered
- Headline costs for each local project
- Details of potential local delivery partners
- The bid will also need the signed support of local partners

This will be needed by **mid July**. Important elements of a successful bid will be a strong evidence base, links with local and regional strategies, building and supporting partnerships and wide consultation.

Agreed Priorities for Sheffield

The Board agreed at its last meeting that Sheffield's input should focus on delivering the LAA, it is suggested that the broad framework therefore be:

- **Outcome:** A reduction in the gap between our most deprived communities and the city average (specific outcomes in relation to this will need to be identified for the three priority areas)
- **Target population:** the neighbourhoods and communities of interest identified in the LAA
- **Activities:** Action to support the delivery of the enhanced public health programs

Coordinating Sheffield's Input to stage 1

Sheffield submission to the regional bid will need to come from the SFHW/PHPB. To support its development a small group has been convened which includes:

- PCT Food, Physical Activity and Mental Health Leeds
- SCC Mental Health Commissioning and Physical Activity Leads
- VCF Representatives
- Care Trust
- Sheffield Wildlife Trust 5 a Day Program
- Sheffield Hallam University
