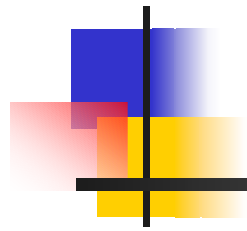

What has happened so far?

- The final LAA presented to the OPSEG
- OPSEG have taken strategic ownership, reporting to the Older Peoples Partnership Board
- Problem solving dialogue took place to understand related work streams, linked to structures, priorities, needs, aspirations and gaps
- The development of an action plan for the work streams
- A joint meeting of the OP lead and the leads for healthy communities to ensure cross linking activities
- Further work is required to work up local outcomes to realise the benefits for older people
- Further work to agree a common data set for organisations to measure progress of outcomes for older people
